Wojciech Zareba, MD, PhD



Dr. Zareba is an Associate Professor of Medicine (Cardiology) at the University of Rochester Medical Center Rochester, NY. Additionally, he is the Director of Clinical Research in the Medical Center's Cardiology Unit, Director of the Heart Research Follow Up Program, and the Director of the ECG Core Lab for the Heart Research Follow Up Program. Dr. Zareba is Principal Investigator on several NIH and corporate grants focused on clinical usefulness and prognostic significance of ECG parameters and on risk stratification of cardiac death. He also serves as Principal

Investigator of the ECG Core Labs for numerous studies including the International LQTS Registry, the North American ARVD Registry, MADIT II, and MADIT-CRT, large clinical trials testing clinical effectiveness and safety of implantable cardiac defibrillators and resynchronization devices. He participated in a number of corporate research projects focused on evaluating drug safety with companies including Hoffman LaRoche, Lorex, Pfizer, Warner-Lambert, Eli-Lilly, Genzyme, and Bristol Meyer Squib. He has also participated in a number of advisory councils on the topic of cardiac safety in drug trials including ISHNE Standards for Drug-Induced QT Prolongation Analysis and FDA Panel on Digital ECG Format for Drug Studies. Dr Zareba has contributed authored or coauthored more that 200 publications in cardiology research with many of them focused on QT prolongation and ECG related cardiac safety biomarkers. He has given over 300 abstract presentations and over 100 invited lectures during several national and international meetings. Dr. Zareba is the Editor in Chief of Cardiology Journal, Deputy Editor of Annals of Noninvasive Electrocardiology as well as a member of the editorial boards of a number of other leading cardiology-related publications including Journal of Cardiovascular Electrophysiology, Heart Rhythm Journal, Journal of Electrocardiology, and Journal of Arrhythmia. Dr. Zareba is President of the International Society for Holter and Noninvasive Electrocardiology. Dr. Zareba obtained his MD degree in Medicine as well as his Ph.D. degree in Cardiology from Medical University of Lodz, Poland.
